## Bronze Duke of Edinburgh's Award 2022/23

Dear Parent/Carer

I am pleased to let you know that Great Marlow School offers the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh's Award (DofE) to students in Year 9. I have delivered an assembly to Year 9 students, detailing the benefits and requirements of the Bronze level of the Award.

The DofE is a great chance for your son/daughter to broaden their horizons, discover new interests and talents, have fun with friends, develop essential skills for their future and achieve an internationally renowned award.

As Great Marlow School's DofE Manager, I wanted to send you some information about what a DofE programme involves, the benefits for your son/daughter, and how they can sign up.

### About the DofE

The DofE is non-competitive and open to all young people – it's about setting personal challenges and pushing personal boundaries. There are three levels of DofE programme which, when successfully completed, lead to a Bronze, Silver or Gold Award.

Through their DofE, students will make friends and memories and build traits like confidence, resilience and self-esteem, which can benefit mental health. They'll gain skills and attributes for work and life, like problem-solving, team-working and self-motivation – and they'll achieve an award that's recognised by employers and can help them stand out when applying for college, university or jobs.

### To achieve their Bronze Award, participants must complete four sections: Skills, Volunteering, Physical and their Expedition.

Every young person's DofE programme is personal to them – they can choose what they'd like to do for their sections, and most activities can count. I will provide guidance and support, and students can either choose to continue an activity they already do or discover something completely new.

Activities for each section take a minimum of one hour a week over a set period of time, so they can fit around studying, hobbies and social lives. For more details about programmes and timescales look at the school website, or visit the DofE website: [www.dofe.org](http://www.dofe.org)

### About the expedition

The Expedition section involves your child working as part of a small team to plan their expedition's aim and do some training to make sure they're fully prepared – before spending two days and one night in the countryside completing their qualifying expedition.

DofE participants can use the 'Opportunity Finder' on the DofE website to find an Approved Activity Provider (AAP) offering an expedition package which suits them. There are plenty of AAPs in the South East region offering a variety of expedition transport options: walking, kayaking, mountain biking or even horseback! By using the Opportunity Finder, participants can also choose dates for their training and qualifying expedition which fit in around any other extra-curricular activities and commitments they may have.

WithDave are an experienced expedition company, who offer young people challenging and adventurous expeditions. Silver and Gold level GMS students have participated in the paddling expeditions they provide, and have thoroughly enjoyed their experiences. WithDave also offer training and a walking expedition to Bronze level GMS students on the following dates:

**Training weekend: 22/23 April 2023**

**Practice expedition: 6/7 May 2023**

**Qualifying expedition: 24/25 June 2023**

**\*All 3 weekends include an overnight camp**

**PLEASE NOTE:**

**This expedition option is available to GMS students who have completed 2 of their DofE sections by February half term.** The cost for the WithDave expedition package is £275. Please see the Opportunity Finder for dates/costings for alternative expedition providers.

**Students are required by the Duke of Edinburgh's conditions to attend all the expedition training and to have demonstrated the required level of competence and behaviour in order to be able to participate in the final assessed expedition.**

**eDofE and the DofE app**

Participants can create their DofE programme and record their progress using eDofE, the DofE's digital system, available online at eDofE.org and through the DofE app – downloadable for free from Google Play and the App Store. If your son/daughter decides to enrol, we will set up their eDofE account and they will receive details of how to sign in and get started.

**Signing up**

**The cost of registering for the Bronze level of the DofE Award at GMS is £30 per participant, payable via WisePay before 30<sup>th</sup> September 2022.** This covers your son/daughter's participation place, Welcome Pack, and Licensed Organisation fee. The Welcome Pack will be sent to their home address and includes their personalised DofE Discount Card.

If your son/daughter would like to take part, please view the Bronze DofE Presentation detailing the requirements of the Award on the school website under 'School Life',

**Please be aware that the cost of the Duke of Edinburgh Award does not guarantee the award being completed and achieved, the time and effort must come from the participants.** However, I will endeavour to provide all students with the opportunity to complete the sections necessary to achieve their Bronze award. In order to monitor and support your son/daughter's progress through the Bronze award, he/she will be required to attend a meeting in school with me once every half term (dates to follow).
