100% A*-E
























80% sounds good?



Parental Support

- Ensure your child has an environment at home to study
- Ensure your child eats BEFORE they leave for school in the morning
- 3. Ensure your child has 9 hours sleep a night
- 4. Ensure you know when your child has an examination
- Encourage them to start their revisiting now




